In numeracy, we will be using Glasgow as our Making Math's Memorable theme. P6/5 took control of their own learning by contributing to the planning process. They held discussions and recorded their ideas on how we will incorporate the theme of Glasgow within our maths concepts.

P6/5 celebrated Mass on the Feast of the Assumption. We have been exploring the Priests Liturgical Vestments and their connection with the liturgical calendar.

In PEBL, P6/5 have started exploring metaskills. The children have led discussions on the importance of all of the metaskills and identified which skill they want to work on the most throughout their first PEBL of the year. The children are very excited to explore Glasgow.
